Stand Up and Take Action Against Poverty and for the Millennium Development Goals October 17-19, 2008



Stand in Solidarity

Mark the 2008 **International Day for the Eradication of Poverty**. Stand in solidarity with those who continue to face poverty with hope and support of the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). Last year over 43 million people Stood Up to demand that world leaders keep their promise to end poverty and inequality. Join the global movement of people who refuse to stay seated in the face of increasing inequality and broken promises.

Why?

In September 2000, heads of government of 189 countries signed the <u>United Nations Millennium Declaration</u> and committed the nations of the world to an agenda for action designed to establish a world free from want, a world free from fear; a world where all people are free to live in dignity.

Still **50,000 people die everyday as a result of extreme poverty** and the gap between rich and poor people is increasing. Nearly half the world's population live in poverty, 70% are women. We have the power to change this.

What?

This year people worldwide will <u>Stand Up</u> (<u>English Español</u>, <u>Português</u>; <u>for French http://www.standagainstpoverty.org/fr</u>) and <u>Take Action</u> to push their governments to keep their promises of more and better aid, debt cancellation, education for all boys and girls, healthcare, trade justice, gender equality and public accountability. Stand with them and publicly demonstrate to policy makers the growing global support for the eradication of poverty and the accomplishment of the MDGs (<u>English</u>, <u>Español</u>).

When?

To make sure more people can take part, we will Stand Up sometime between **October 17** and **19**, as the International Day for the Eradication of Poverty unfolds across the world.

How?

Participating in this **worldwide solidarity event** is easy and all the resources you need (posters, the pledge, sign-up forms and additional information) are available in the event toolkit at www.standagainstpoverty.org. (English, Español, and Português)

- 1. Plan your event to take place between 9:00 pm GMT on October 17th and 9:00 pm GMT on October 19th.
- 2. Pre-register your event at www.standagainstpoverty.org.
- 3. During your event ask everyone to stand for 1 minute and read the pledge.

Take Action

We are also asking you to take action. This could be in conjunction with the event itself or something you do individually. There are any number of other ways to contribute towards ending poverty and inequality. You might:

- Pray! (cfr., Millennium Prayer below)
- Write to your government officials. Ask them to put an end to poverty and inequality and support the MDGs.
- Organize food distribution.
- Donate used-books and school supplies.
- Give blood.
- Improve basic sanitation facilities. Dig a well or build a latrine.
- Distribute mosquito nets.
- Plant tress.
- Start a no plastic bag campaign.
- Write letters to local media.
- Post banners and posters.
- Distribute pamphlets.
- Sponsor a MDG quiz, debates, poster or essay competition.
- Send an instant message to your friends about poverty eradication.
- Give a public speech or lecture.
- Wear and distribute white bands.
- Give a concert. Perform the **Poverty Requiem**.
- Organize a religious procession.
- Teach about the MDGs.
- Visit your local officials and tell them about your commitment to end poverty.
- Fast for world hunger.
