



HUMAN TRAFFICKING STATISTICS

- Human trafficking is the world's second largest criminal enterprise, after drugs and weapons.¹
- Worldwide, there are over one million children entering the commercial sex trade every year and approximately 30 million children have lost their childhood through sexual exploitation over the past 30 years.²
- There are an estimated 600,000 to 800,000 children, women and men trafficked across international borders annually.¹
- An estimated 14,500 to 17,500 women and children are trafficked into the USA each year.¹
- Approximately 80 percent of human trafficking victims are women and girls, and up to 50 percent are minors.¹
- The total market value of illicit human trafficking is estimated to be in excess of \$32 billion.³
- Sex trafficking is an engine of the global AIDS epidemic.¹
- There are an estimated 1.2 million child sex slaves in India alone.⁴
- An average serial child molester may have as many as 400 victims in his lifetime.

Our Mission

SCTNow exists to stop child trafficking by targeting the source of child trafficking: predators who drive the sex industry everywhere in the world, including in your local community. The SCTNow National Campaign has three main objectives: 1) Awareness -- The average American has no idea this crime is happening all over our nation. 2) Activation -- Once a person is aware, our goal is to activate them toward being part of the solution. 3) Fundraising -- Our hope is that every aware and activated citizen will help raise funds so that each of us doing our part can collectively make a major impact in funding operative teams-- first in the U.S., and then abroad.

National Walk Campaign

September 26- 27, 2009, was a historic weekend for the over 1 million children who are exploited through sexual slavery. 39 communities and over 80 campuses nationwide participated in the 1st annual Stop Child Trafficking Now Walk Campaign to raise awareness and over half a million dollars to Stop Child Trafficking Now. Second year events are slated for October 2-3, 2010.

Call to Action

Special Operative Teams are awaiting deployment. Their methods are proven, their resolve is strong. They are limited only by the need for operational mission expenses to bring child predators to justice.
