

DIRECTIONS

By MBTA:

From Kenmore Square (Green Line):

Take the Watertown Bus #57.

From Watertown Square:

Take the Kenmore Square Bus #57.

By CAR:

From North or South:

Take Route 93 (Southeast Expressway) to Mass Pike Westbound. Take Allston/Brighton Exit (#20).

This places you on Cambridge Street. Follow for about 1 mile. Sisters of St. Joseph Motherhouse will be on your right.

From the West:


Take the Mass Pike Eastbound. Take Allston/Brighton Exit (#18). This places you on Cambridge Street. Follow for about 1 mile.

From Storrow Drive Westbound:

Take Central Sq/Mass Pike Exit (at Guest Quarters Suite Hotel). Take a left onto Cambridge Street. Follow for about 1 mile.

From Storrow Drive Eastbound:

Take Central Sq/Mass Pike Exit. Take a right onto Cambridge Street. Follow for about 1 mile.
